World records and new titles

Details of the proposals

A. New members of FMJD

The membership was confirmed for the federations of Portugal, Canada, Pakistan and Northern Ireland.

B. Elections for Executive Board and committees

Composition new financial committee

Aare Harak from Estonia, Milena Szatkowska from Italy and Xia Lu from China were re-elected in the financial committee.

Composition new ethical committee:

Claude Ngondiep was elected as the new president of this committee. The members Igor Rybakov and Airat Nurgaziyev were re-elected and the newly elected members are, after several votes between 4 candidates proposed by the General Assembly, Ibrahim Isamilov and Darya Tkachenko.

Election members Executive Board:

Treasurer Frits Luteijn and Tournament Director Johan Demasure were re-elected.

C. Proposals of the federations

Proposal of the players by Latvia to come with an improved version of the Swiss system

The proposal is to recognize that the Swiss on rating is not fair for top players in certain aspects and that the General Assembly gives its agreement that the top players come with a better proposal to be treated at the next General Assembly. We do not propose to abolish the Swiss system on rating now.

Proposals from Poland about the section 64 Russian Draughts

the General Assembly gives the Executive Council the right to put the section 64 Russian draughts out of FMJD if they keep combining IDF and FMJD section 64 in one name, which would mean there will not be 64 Russian Draughts within FMJD. The same sanctions can be applied if Section 64 Russian will organise events for other draughts sports as 64 Russian without written permission from the Executive council of FMJD.

Proposals of the Executive Board

Important remark: This proposal is accepted under the condition that the organising federation can organise the World Championship in this form !!

New World Championship system

There are two main goals:

- to give chance to play in WC for each champion from our member federation
- to give a chance to play in WC for top players out of any country limit

Current system of World Championship with 40

We succeed it in Abidjan 1996, Amsterdam 2005, Ufa 2013. Each time we had preliminary rounds (semi-finals) and final with 12.

- Abidjan – 5 groups of 8. Best two were promoted to the final with 12 (Chizov and Valneris had already direct place there). Next day after barrages to the final, not promoted players go home.
- Amsterdam – 4 groups of 10 with best 3 to the final.
- Ufa – 4 groups of 10 with best 3 to the final (with results between themselves included, so only 9 rounds in the final). Not promoted players could stay for free till the end and play in the open Swiss tournament.

World Championship with 84 players

With such a big tournament we can expect big problems with budget for hospitality. Potential problem with budget (a lot of people). So it looks interesting to do it with new idea:

- lots of people with rights to play but limited number of players with free hospitality.
- also system need to be realistic. Our experience shows that it is really heavy to get all confirmations etc on time.

- **(1)** World Champion Juniors 2016

- (1) Nomination from FMJD President
- (34) places without free hospitality:

- ... the rest of free places in order of World Cup on January 1st 2017

System:

- **Semi-finals** 3 groups of 28 players 9 rounds
- **Final** with 11 players

World Championship Women

Proposition for 2017

Number of participants – **16**:

1. (3) top 3 from 2015
2. (2) sponsor – organizer
3. (6) Europe
4. (3) Asia
5. (1) America
6. (1) Africa

For places 3-4:

1. max 2 from same country
2. only after qualification tournaments played by the end of 2016 (details belongs to Confederations)

Reserve places:

- Only for countries which regularly organize (and reported to FMJD) national women championships: Belarus, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Mongolia, Netherlands, Poland, Russia, Ukraine.
- Countries one by one in order of **country** rating on January 1st 2017, taking into account limit 2 per countries for continental places.
- Players nominated by federations.

proposals of the Technical Committee

1. Reserve for world title match

when the conditions for the world title match are acceptable for the FMJD Executive Board the players have the obligation to play (unless they come with a better possibility). If one of them does not accept the conditions a reserve may take his/her place. The reserve is the next player from the last World Championship tournament.

2. Organization of world title match by the federation of the Challenger

The world title match has to be organised by the federation represented by the challenger.

Other federations may also come with an offer. If another offer is better, FMJD chooses that offer.

The reason for this rule is that it becomes more and more difficult to organise the match, also because no federation feels responsible and everyone expects that the Netherlands or the Executive Board of FMJD will organize such a title match.

With this rule it is clear which federation is expected to organize a title match.

3. Allow other counting systems in our regulations Annex 3

Changes in annex 3 are proposed to make it possible for every organisation, if they like it, to play with alternative counting systems, like the Beijing system or the plus remise or the system which has been recently used in the grandmastergroup of the Heerhugowaard tournament.

The current regulations in Annex 3 which are proposed to be changed are articles 5.6 – 5.10

This is the proposed new formulation of these articles (underlined text is new text, ~~strikethrough~~ text is deleted text):

5.6. *Game points*

In a standard competition points are allotted to each game result:

5.6.1. 2 points are allotted for a win

5.6.2. 1 point is allotted for a draw;

5.6.3. 0 points are allotted for a loss.

5.6a

A competition may also use alternative counting systems with other results for win and draw and/or with results for each round depending on the combined results of a normal game and/or rapid and blitz games.

Some examples: the plus-remise and the Beijing counting system.

In the plus remise system a plus remise is awarded to the player who cannot win the game but has a lasting advantage of at least 3 men at the end of the game (where a King counts for 2 men).

The result is written as 1+ - 1-

In the Beijing counting system each round consists of a normal game, a rapid game, a blitz game and an LG tiebreak.

A player who wins the normal game gets a result of 12-0. If the normal game is a draw a rapid game is played. A player who wins the rapid game gets a result of 9-3. If the rapid game ends in a draw a blitz game is played.

The winner of the blitz game gets a result 8-4. If the blitz game ends in a draw an LG tiebreak is played (see article 5.10). The winner of this tiebreak gets a result 7-5.

Other counting methods are also accepted.

However for rating calculations the results of the game(s) in a round will be counted using the standard game points of article 5.6.

If the tournament regulations do not mention any alternative counting system then the standard counting system of article 5.6 has to be used.

5.7. *Forfeiting result*

When a player is absent, or when he cannot play the scheduled game for whatever reason, his scheduled opponent receives the number of forfeit points belonging to winning the game. ~~2 forfeit points.~~

The same holds for a player who is more than ONE hour late at his board.

5.8. *Forfeiting result for two players*

When two players are absent or unable to play the game scheduled between the two of them for whatever reason, the result of that game will be zero – zero.

5.9. *Withdrawing from the competition*

When a player withdraws from the competition, for whatever reason, he proceeds as follows:

A. *In a round robin tournament:*

- a. If he has not played more than half of the scheduled games, his results on the final table are cancelled and he will not be classified;
- b. If he has played more than half of the games, his results will remain on the final table and he will be classified. The non-played games will be considered forfeit losses, and indicated as ~~“OF” and “ZF”~~ with an F (for Forfeit) or R (for Regulatory) behind the result on the final tournament table.

B. *In a Swiss tournament:*

The results of a player who has withdrawn will stand and he will be classified according to the games he played.

Addition to article 5.10 *Final classification and tie breaking:*

5.10a *Final classification and tie breaking using alternative counting methods*

When alternative counting methods are used (see article 5.6a) the tournament regulations have to mention if and how the tie breaking rules will be different from the standard rules in the article 5.11.

4. 25 moves rule for a draw in Annex 1 article 6.2 rules of the game

The 25 moves rule in Annex 1 is not clear enough and may lead to misinterpretation. Article 6.2. If during 25 successive moves, only the kings have moved, without any man moving or without any capture, the game is considered drawn.

Proposed change:

6.2. If during 25 successive moves for each player, only the kings have moved, without any man moving or without any capture, the game is considered drawn.

Articles 6.3 and 6.4 about the 16 moves rule and the 5 moves rule already include the text “for each player” but this text was not yet present in article 6.2.

Annexe 1 français :

6.2 Si, durant 25 coups successifs, il n'y a eu que déplacements de dames, sans déplacement de pion ni aucune prise, la fin de partie sera considérée égale.

Changement proposé :

6.2 s'il n'y a que déplacements de dames, sans déplacements de pion ni aucune prise, la fin de partie sera considérée égale lorsque les deux joueurs auront encore joué chacun 25 coups au maximum

La modification important est le mot "chacun", mais aussi la formulation a été changé pour avoir une formulation comme aux articles 6.3 and 6.4.

5. Tie break rules

Adding a technical improvement to article 5.10 tie break rules:

When all tie breaking criteria of article 5.11 are equal or when no decision can be made on the basis of the tie break rules the places are shared, unless the tournament regulations specify otherwise.

6. Changes in regulations for World Records

For the World Record Regulations clock simultaneous games and blind simultaneous games a minimum is set of 90 % players with a rating instead of now minimum 70 %
For the World Record Regulations clock simultaneous games and blind simultaneous games a maximum of 10 % of the opponents may be a member of the club from which the expert is a member. This is to avoid that too much opponents may be more interested in letting the record attempt succeed than in playing a good game.

World records and New titles

World records:

The world record clock simultaneous games by Marino Barkel, 17-5-2014.

with 43 games and 64 points (74,42 %) he succeeded in getting more than the necessary number of points (70 % is 60,2). The main referee, Rima Danileviciene, advised to accept the record and the Executive Board accepted the world record in its meeting October 2014.

The world record blind simultaneous games by Ton Sijbrands on December 19,20,21, 2015

The main referee Paul Visser advises to accept the record and the Executive Board accepted the new record in its meeting in August 2015
